Business strategies can be classified into three general categories: (1) least cost, (2) differentiation, and (3) focus.

It can be used at the process or company level to compare the manufacturing capabilities with the market requirements to determine areas of mismatch and identify steps needed for realignment.	Those competitive characteristics that cause a firm's customers to choose that firm's goods and services over those of its competitors.
